- 1) Collect all the information available on the family
- 2) Create Genealogy Folders

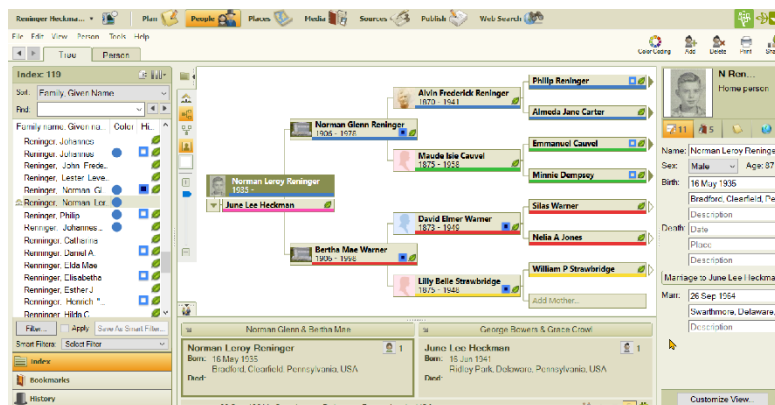
- 3) Digitize all the photos and documents – scan and name, put in “Files to Sort” folder

- 4) Open Family Tree Maker or where ever you will build your tree





- a. Start new tree for this project (or add to current tree)
 - i. Begin with yourself or youngest one in tree to begin
 - ii. Use your digital files and after entering the data (cite sources) be careful
 - iii. After entering information from file, then move to individual folder
 - iv. Number family members from most current 1 to oldest

- 5) Begin online research (living individuals will not be available)
- 6) Find out if any of the Grandparents or older are in FamilySearch
 - a. Open FamilySearch → Search → Records
 - i. Enter first, last and date of birth (to start – then add more info)
 - ii. If you find one or more, open the person 
 1. write down their ID “2W2D-ZKT”
 - b. If you can tie into the Family Tree – your lucky
 - i. Open the person page
 - ii. Open Sources (do not just copy data unless it has valid sources)
 1. Open each of the sources, download source to your computer, name it and put it into “Files to Sort”, remember to copy source citation
 2. Go back o Step 4 to thoroughly read information and log it into your tree
- 7) Open Ancestry.com (if you have subscription or at the Library or Family History Center)
 - a. Open Search → All Collections
 - i. Enter first, last and date of birth (to start – then add more info)
 - ii. Look at the available files, if you looks like it may match then open 
 1. If it is your ancestor – download original to computer – name it and put it into “Files to Sort”, remember to copy source citation, you may also want to copy (snipping tool) the typed information as reference
 - iii. Get as much information as you can find, you may try different searches
- 8) On Family Tree Maker, make sure you allow access to FamilySearch and Ancestry (if you have accounts with each) 
 - a. This allows the hints to show, which you can open to investigate and merge to your FTM 
 - b. You can grab data and merge directly into FTM
- 9) If you have an Ancestry account (not necessary to have a subscription), sync your FTM with Ancestry
 - a. You can now do your research in Ancestry.com, save files, include new information and it will be synced with your FTM
- 10) Now that I have gotten whatever sources that were EASY to get, it is time to figure out where the blanks remain. Create a Timeline for overall family, or separate sheets for each family

 - b. FindAGrave
 - c. Fold3 (military - \$)
- 14) Keep your document so you own them and take time to study them and include them later in your Family History
